



- Developing effective and coordinated caring teams requires awareness and skills



## 'Coaching in the Moment'

#### What is coaching?

• "Unlocking a person's potential to maximize his or her own performance" (Whitmore, 2009)

#### When to coach?

- If time is the predominant criterion- do or tell
- If quality of the results matters most- coach
- If maximizing the learning is most important- coach

#### Questions are the answer!

- Asking questions is the most effective way to change thinking
- Questions best generate awareness and responsibility
- Effective vs. Ineffective questions
  - Open-ended
  - What, where, who, how questions
  - Avoid asking why questions and leading questions
